- Over 2.7 billion cook with traditional fuels





Global info on the ACP-EU Energy Facility

- Set up in 2006 following the EU Energy Initiative for Poverty Eradication and Sustainable Development (EUEI)
- Endowed with €445m in total
- Overall objective: to contribute to the MDGs on poverty alleviation as well as WSSD objectives on energy while helping to fight against climate change

• Specific objectives:

- To increase access to modern, affordable and sustainable energy services in rural and peri-urban poor areas.
- To improve governance and framework conditions in the energy sector at regional, national and local levels





Implementation modalities

- Calls for Proposals: 2 were launched in 2006 and 2009; a new one by the end of 2012
- the Pooling Mechanism created in 2010 with the objective to blend EF grants with resources with other donors (Development Banks & Agencies, private sector).
- Support to the EUEI-Partnership Dialogue Facility (EUEI-PDF) to support development of policies and strategies for the promotion of access to energy at national and regional level.





Results so far

- 139 national and cross-border projects in ACP countries for about 300M€ have been funded through Calls for Proposals.
- 2 projects financed by the Pooling in Uganda (with KfW) and Kenya (AFD)
- Almost 15 million people should benefit of an improved access to energy through the programme and mostly with Renewable energies.






Calls for Proposals

EF allocation of funds (M€) by nature of project





Focus of the Energy Facility

- access to energy services in a pro-poor perspective
- renewable energy and energy efficiency, use of local resources and decentralised solutions
- productive use of energy beyond the basic service
- coherence with partner countries' planning frameworks
- promotion of sound energy policies and strategies
- removal of obstacles to private sector's involvement





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Monitoring of the ACP-EU Energy Facility

The 1st ACP-EU Energy Facility was established in 2005 to co-finance projects on increasing access to modern and sustainable energy services for the poor in African, Caribbean and Pacific (ACP) countries. After a Call for Proposals, <u>74 projects</u> were contracted for a total amount of €196 M, with total project cost of €430M.

The Monitoring of the ACP-EU Energy Facility has two main purposes:

- To provide information, advice and support to the EC's Delegations in charge of the management of the Energy Facility's contracts. Project implementing bodies can benefit from this assistance
- To facilitate rapid and effective reporting from the Task Managers of the Energy Facility to the hierarchy and to the external partners of the EC.

The present website emphasises the dissemination of project results. It will allow to:

- Contribute to the quality in implementation through the dissemination of results, successful stories and lessons learned from the Energy Facility's projects
- Foster contacts and exchanges of experience between projects

The Call for Proposals 2012






Available envelop

Initial amount of €75M (could be up to €95m)

"Two-steps" CfP (concept note + detailed proposal)

Allows better preparation of proposals, avoids unnecessary investment in project preparation <u>but</u> takes more time



Developed and Cooperation EuropeAid



Two Components (specific objectives)

- To increase and improve access to modern, affordable and sustainable energy services for rural and peri-urban poor by focusing on renewable energy solutions as well as on energy efficiency measures.
- To improve governance and framework conditions in the energy sector at regional, national and local levels, in particular those aimed at promoting access to energy services, renewable energy and energy efficiency.





Mandatory Priorities:

- Focus on the target group;
- Effectiveness;
- Ownership & alignment;
- Complementarity & articulation with other donors, particularly EU (role of lead donor during eval.)
- Partnerships;
- Sustainability



As an Advantage:

- Private sector involvement/Leverage;
- Innovation;
- Scaling-Up;
- Support to authorities in charge of rural electrification / rural energy;
- Productive use of Energy;
- Access to energy services for public services;
- Energy-Food nexus

Potential applicants and partners:


- All ACP: State Actors, public and private bodies, NGOs, regional and continental organisations,...
- All EU: public and private bodies, NGOs, ... but compulsory partnership with an ACP actor
- International Organisations (primarily made of ACP States)
- Other International Organization can participate as partner
- PADOR registration is compulsory!

Associates and co-donors: no restriction





Two-step CfP procedure launch expected on 15 November





Concept note

- Brief document, easy to prepare
- Project ideas and stakeholders
- Concrete, well written and clear (open model)
- Emphasis on Relevance to the objectives of the EF
- General information about: technology, beneficiaries, costs, activities, co-financing
- Possible deadline 15th January 2013



Evaluation of Concept Note

1) Relevance

- More importance of relevance of the action in the overall score (/30 points, out of a total of 50, Minimum threshold : 22)

- Relevance assessed only at the Concept Note stage

2) Design of the Action

- / 20 pts and evaluation also in the Detailed Proposal

NEW: the Evaluation grid will contains the sub-criteria on the basis of which the Concept Note will be assessed.





Detailed Proposal - Required:

- Description of the whole action
- Partners, associates
- Logical Framework suitable for monitoring activities (indicators)
- Budget and Leverage (co-financing)
- Detailed Procurement plan
- Feasibility studies (for comp. 1 projects) optional but highly recommended. For projects > 2yrs to be reviewed at end 1st yr
- Ecofin Analysis + El (for comp. 1 projects) particularly in private sector proposals





Detailed Proposal- Required:

 Support from national authorities and alignment with national energy planning

- Engagement of co-donors
- Acknowledge on-going and foreseen actions in the same location and sector
- Deadline for presentation communicated to pre-selected applicants





Detailed Proposal evaluation

- 1) Financial and operational capacity focused on the mgmt of energy services (/20 points, min 12)
- 2) Effectiveness and feasibility of the action /20pts
- 3) Sustainability of the action /15 points
- 4) Budget and cost-effectiveness of the action /15 points
