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








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Reference level: historical emissions as BaU





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4. Safeguards and social aspects

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Safeguards



- 2. When undertaking the [REDD] activities referred to in paragraph 70 of this decision, the following safeguards should be promoted and supported:
- (c) Respect for the knowledge and rights of indigenous peoples and members of local communities [...];
- (d) The full and effective participation of relevant stakeholders, in particular indigenous peoples and local communities, in the actions referred to in paragraphs 70 and 72 of this decision;
- (e) That actions are consistent with the **conservation of natural forests and** biological diversity, ensuring that the [REDD] actions [...] are not used for the conversion of natural forests, but are instead used to incentivize the protection and conservation of natural forests and their ecosystem services, and to enhance other social and environmental benefits;





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REDD+: invesment instrument & local agents



"Payments for avoided deforestation could thus be proposed to small-scale holders and local communities, combined with programs for crop intensification.

[...] to invest in new policies and reforms aimed to critical socioeconomic transformations. The incentives [...] should be targeted to those who are likely to respond to them: the economic agents in the field such as farmers, communities, enterprises, etc."

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


